Fabric crocus buttonholes are offered to members of the public in return for a donation. When donors wear their Crocuses they become walking adverts and trigger countless conversations about Rotary and the End Polio Now Campaign.

Each Crocus comes on an information card which tells the story of the eradication program and Rotary's pivotal role in it. It provides the wearer with the answer to the question 'that's a nice flower, what's it for?'

The Crocus was chosen as the purple colour matched the dye painted on the fingers of children who have been immunised against Polio.

How to Use the Crocus

The Crocus is ideal to support Rotary Day, World Polio Day or any other fundraising occasion.

Schools:
